- Depends on context
- Leads to misunderstanding and confusion
- Two different senses used in the same sentence

#### Is the model of a model a metamodel?

- Cannot answer without knowing what a 'model' is

- Four sources of knowledge:
  - Encyclopedias
  - Dictionaries
  - Thesauri
  - Etymology

- Four groups of meanings:
  - Model-as-representation
  - Model-as-example
  - Model-as-type
  - Model-as-mold

### Encyclopedia

- A model of the knowledge of mankind
- Model: "A 3-dimensional, typically small construction, intended to illustrate, explain, or discover certain properties of its prototype, the subject that it represents."





### Dictionary

- A model of the language


- 1. A small object, usually built to scale, that represents in detail another, often larger object.

- **a.** A preliminary work or construction that serves as a plan from which a final product is to be made: a clay model ready for casting.
- **b.** Such a work or construction used in testing or perfecting a final product: a test model of a solar-powered vehicle.
- **3.** A schematic description or representation of something, especially a system or phenomenon, that accounts for its properties and is used to study its characteristics: a model of generative grammar; a model of an atom; an economic model.
- 4. A style or design of an item: My car is last year's model.
- 5. One serving as an example to be imitated or compared: a model of decorum. See Synonyms at ideal.

- 8. Zoology An animal whose appearance is copied by a mimic.



- A simplification of a system
- Built with an intended goal in mind
- Able to answer questions in place of the actual system


#### A metamodel is:


- A model of a modeling language
- A model of a language of models

<sup>\*</sup>Language = Set of sentences

#### A megamodel is:


- A model whose elements represent models, metamodels and other global entities
- Considers global relationships without considering their content
- Represents complex arrangements without entering in details
- Not tied to a technical space / domain







### Mega-Patterns:

 Recurrent pattern that defines a collaboration between some systems in a megamodel






#### **S-Pattern**





### Key Principle:


- Everything is a system!








#### Is the model of a model a metamodel?
